Whilst I appreciate that BS5837:2012 will be adhered to in this case, I wanted to clarify that the buffer zone for T22 would be in line with recommendations for veteran trees specifically, i.e. RPA at least 15 times the diameter of the stem, or 5m beyond the canopy edge (whichever is greatest). On 27 October 2020 the applicant submitted the requested further information, and the County Council are now seeking comments on this further information in relation to a number of matters including: water environment, ecology and biodiversity, landscape agricultural land classification and soils, cultural heritage, transport movement and access, rights of way, and restoration and aftercare.
